We Gather at the Table

Our Invitation—As the saints before did, so, too, do we carry on the tradition of gathering around Christ's holy table, bringing all that we are, our longing for sustenance and grace. Surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, we gather at this table where grace flows freely and mercy abounds. With the longing of your heart, come to be filled. Here there is a place for you.

Our Confession—Reach us in our need, loving God, for we wander as lost children without your presence in our lives. When our hope fails and our confidence is shaken, renew us in your mercy. When our footsteps falter and our eyesight dims, place our feet firmly on the paths of life. Remind us that

The Words of Institution— On the night in which he gave himself up for us, he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." And so, we remember…we offer ourselves…we proclaim God's love…

Blessing Our Meal—Pour out your Holy Spirit on us, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the life and love of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed, renewed, and blessed by your love and grace. By your Spirit, make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world. Bless us until Christ comes in final victory and we feast at the heavenly banquet with the saints of your church and the many touched by your grace. Through Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty God, now and forevermore. Amen.~

We Share the Bread and the Cup – As you eat the bread, remember, "This is the body of Christ broken for you." Take and eat. As you drink the cup, remember, "This is the blood of Christ shed for you and the forgiveness of sins." Take and drink.

We Give Thanks—Almighty God, we give you thanks for the gift of our Savior's presence in the simplicity and splendor of this holy meal. Unite us with all who are fed by Christ's body and blood that we may faithfully proclaim the good news of your love and that your universal church may be a rainbow of hope in an uncertain world; through Jesus Christ our Redeemer. Amen.`
