Luke 19:1-10 (NRSVUE)

[Jesus] entered Jericho and was passing through it. ² A man was there named Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was rich. ³ He was trying to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was short in stature. ⁴ So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to see him, because he was going to pass that way. ⁵ When Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down, for I must stay at your house today." ⁶ So he hurried down and was happy to welcome him. ⁷ All who saw it began to grumble and said, "He has gone to be the guest of one who is a sinner." ⁸ Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Look, half of my possessions, Lord, I will give to the poor, and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much." ⁹ Then Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he, too, is a son of Abraham. ¹⁰ For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost."

Set Your Place at the Table—For those worshipping with us at home, please use whatever you have on hand to represent the bread and the cup. For those worshipping with us in-person, communion cups are available on the table in the back of the sanctuary.

Our Invitation

A Prayer for Transformation (unison)—God, what would we do without your welcome and your embrace? We give you thanks that you saw Zacchaeus and did not turn away but opened your heart in love to him. You do the same for us. Like Zacchaeus, may we recognize the wrongs we have done, the ways we have not been so loving and kind, our participation in the injustice of the world. Help us to change our ways. Meet us at your table now as you met Zacchaeus in his home that your redeeming love might save us anew. Amen.

Assurance of Grace—Christ came to seek out and save the lost. This day salvation has come to this house. Receive Christ's forgiveness, and in your repentance help others to see how wondrous grace and mercy truly are. Know that you are forgiven. Amen.

The Words of Institution—We remember that on the night of betrayal and desertion, and on the eve of death, Jesus gathered the disciples for the feast of Passover. Jesus took the bread, and after giving thanks..., broke it, and give it to the disciples, saying: "This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." Therefore we proclaim the mystery of our faith.'

Blessing Our Meal—Merciful God, in bread and cup make your grace known in our lives. As Christ meets us in the brokenness of this bread, help us to see the path toward healing and wholeness. Pour out your Spirit into this sacred meal, and pour out your Spirit into our lives that we may live redeemed. Amen.
